position statement

BACKGROUND:

Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency (MSB) is a governmental agency under the Swedish Ministry of Defence. In the Government Ordinance (2008:1002) with Instructions for the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency it is stated that:

The MSB shall support and coordinate societal information security work, as well as analyse and assess global developments in this field. This includes providing advice and support in matters related to preventive work to other government authorities, the municipalities and the county councils, as well as the private sector and organisations. The MSB shall also report to the government on conditions in the information security field that can give rise to a need for measures on different levels and within different areas of society.

Furthermore, the MSB shall also be responsible for a Swedish national service tasked with supporting society in its efforts to prevent and manage IT incidents.

STATEMENT:

The MSB supports in general collaborative protection profiles (cPPs) produced by international technical communities endorsed by the CCRA Management Committee.

For particular technical domains or cPP:s, the MSB may issue statement about exceptions for this support.

Once the resulting cPP been completed, and associated Supporting Documents approved by the CCRA, MSB will publicly endorse the resulting cPP. Through this endorsement products which can be demonstrated to be in conformance with the cPP will be recommended by MSB for public procurement and usage in accordance with use cases identified in the cPP. Conformance shall be

demonstrated through certified evaluations of such products against the cPP within Common Criteria evaluation and certification schemes recognized by Sweden.

In addition, MSB intends to initiate negotiations with The National Procurement Services during 2015 to investigate the possibilities to make cPPs a part of The National Procurement Services coordinated framework agreements for goods and services of general use.

IT-products intended to store, process and/or transmit information carrying a protective marking according to Swedish law, may be subject to additional national requirements.
